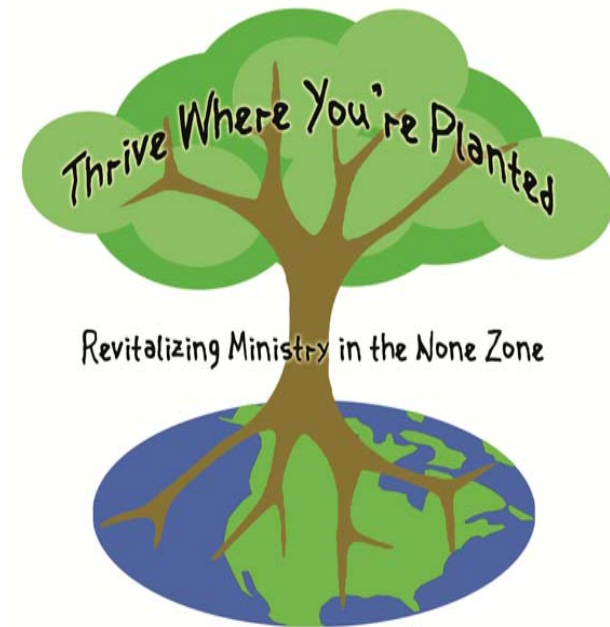


Revitalizing ministry in the None Zone requires a different approach than in other parts of the country. Most church growth conferences do not take into account the cultural realities of the Pacific Northwest.
